Transportation

Social Programme

Prize Presentation

The top 3 ranks in the individual and team competitions will be presented with medals respectively. Medals presentation for individual events as well as Team and Pairs events will be held at the venue immediately after the Finals. The Hong Kong Jockey Club Outstanding Novice Awards (Overseas/Local) will be presented at the Gala Dinner.

Classification

Classification will take place on 14 and 15 August at Room 2318 of the Official Hotel. Participants who require classification are requested to bring along relevant document with them at the time arranged according to the classification schedule (Appendix B).

Team Managers' Meeting

Two Team Managers' Meeting will be held on 15 August at 1600 and 17 August at 2100 in the meeting room on the 26/F of the Official Hotel.

Medical Support

First aid service will be provided by the St. John Ambulance at the competition venue. Physiotherapy support will also be provided at the Press Room 1 of the swimming pool area. Teams are reminded to secure medical and accident insurance for their members before departure.

Wheelchair Repair

Classification at the 3rd Asia and South Pacific Boccia Championships 2009 (3rd ASP Champ.) shall run in accordance with the 9th Edition Cerebral Palsy International Sports and Recreation Association Manual.

Events of the 3rd ASP Champ. will run in accordance with the 10th Edition CPISRA International Boccia Rules

In case of doubt or disagreement in the interpretation of the rules, the English version shall prevail.

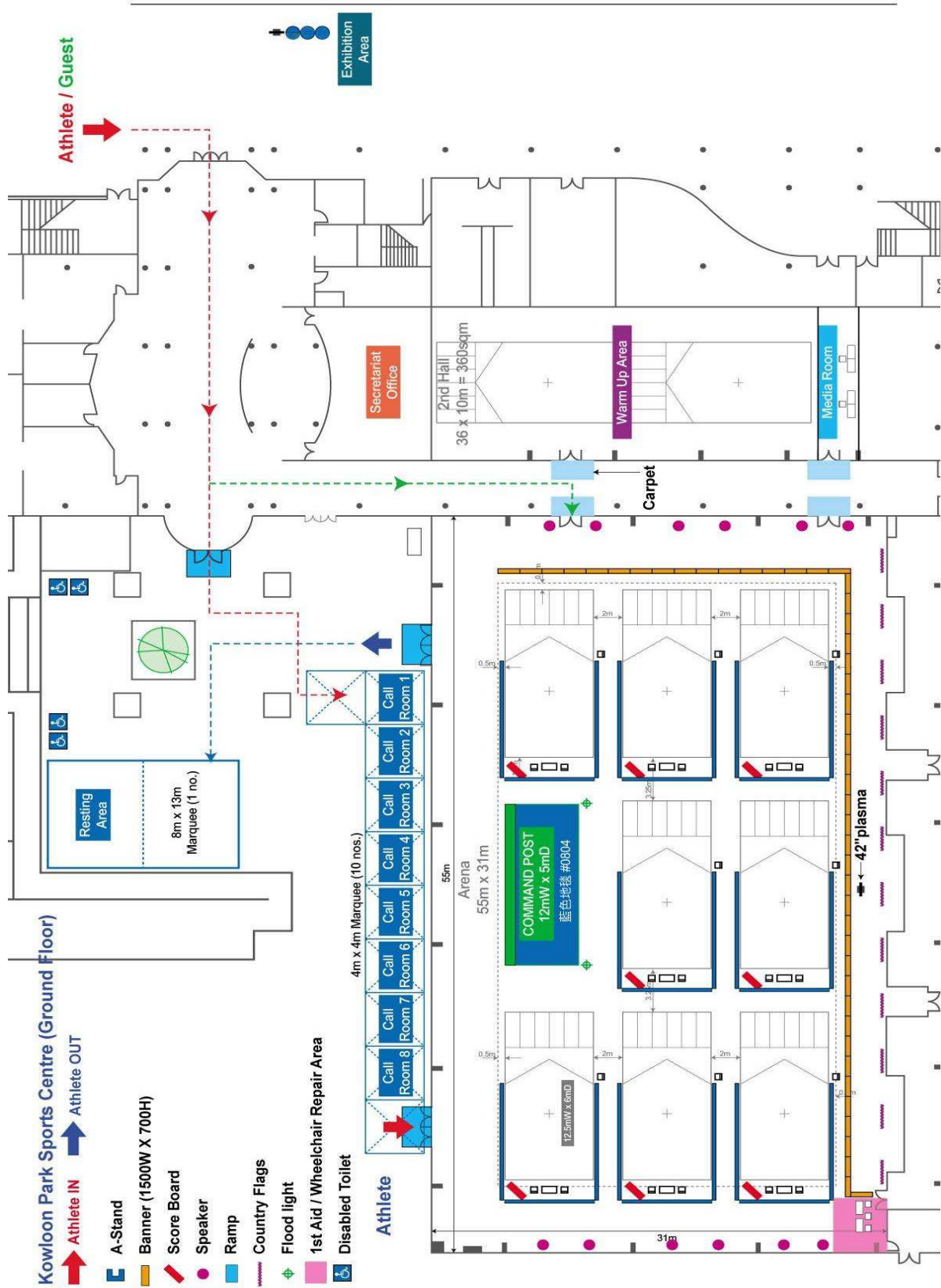

Accreditation

All participants will receive accreditation upon arrival.

Classification

The Chief Classifier for the competition is the Head of Classification of CPISRA Boccia Committee, MATTHEE Elsa. The Classification Schedule can be found in APPENDIX B.

1. Athletes must come for classification at the schedule time with the following items.
 - The appropriate equipment to include chutes/ramps, boccia ball holders, head pointers, wheelchairs, splints and any other piece of equipment they use during competition.
 - Passport or ID Card
 - List of medications
 - Information on their disability

2. One person may accompany athletes from their national federation. A translator may also accompany the athlete if approved by the Chief Classifier.

Classification Protest Form

Available at the Classification Room and the Secretariat Office.

Sports Equipment & Sports Equipment Check

Athletes may use their own Sports Equipment. Sports Equipment includes:

- Balls
- Wheelchairs
- Assistive devices
- Head pointers

Prior to the competition commencing, from 14th to the morning of 15th, Sports Equipment will be checked by the referees team led by the Head Referee / Assistant Head Referee. The Equipment Check will be done in the Venue when countries come for their training sessions (Appendix C).

Equipment that meets the criteria as outlined in the 10th Edition CPISRA International Boccia Rules, will be approved and signed by the Head Referee / Assistant Head Referee (balls will not be signed, but subject to random checking inside Call Room). Equipment not meeting the criteria will not be approved.

At any time, except during a match, the referee may confirm the eligibility of any piece of equipment. Any equipment that fails eligibility during competition shall be confiscated for the remainder of the competition; details of this offence will be published at the Secretariat Office.

The Competition

The countries eligible to compete in the 3rd ASP Champ. are those who have paid all entry fees in full, submitted all required registration information and are current paid members of CPISRA.

A full list of participating athletes will be provided to Team Managers at the end of the 1st Team Managers' Meeting held on 15 August,

Entrants

Competitors must be 15 years of age or older by the first day of the year 2009.

Division of Play

Individual BC1, BC2, BC3, BC4 and Pairs BC3, Pairs BC4 and BC1/BC2 Teams.

Entries per Event

The maximum number of athletes per country in any individual event (BC1, BC2, BC3, BC4) is three (3).

BC1/BC2 Team:	5
BC3 Pairs	: 3
BC4 Pairs	: 3

Team/Pairs Events

Each country must declare their Team and Pair athletes who shall compete in the Team and Pairs events not later than 17 August noon. Teams and Pairs must be in accordance with Rules 4.6, 4.7 and 4.8 of the CPISRA 10th Edition International Boccia Rules.

Rule 4.6 Pairs BC3

...A Pair BC3 must include a substitute. Exceptions will be at discretion of the CBC whose decision will be final. A Pair BC3 must include at least one CP Player on court.

For this competition, a BC3 pair can consist of 2 competitors classified as eligible to play in the individual BC3 division, but at least 1 of them must be a CP Player.

Rule 4.7 Pairs BC4

...A Pair BC4 must include a substitute.

For this competition, a BC4 pair can consist of 2 competitors classified as eligible to play in the individual BC4 division.

Competition Schedule and Team Managers' Meetings

The final competition schedule for individuals will be made available after the Official Draw at the 1st Team Managers' Meeting held on 15 August in the meeting room on the 26/F of the Official Hotel.

The Official Draw for the Team/Pairs Events will take place at the 2nd Team Managers' Meeting to be held on 17 August in the meeting room on the 26/F of the Official Hotel.

Competitor Numbers

Upon confirmation of classification, each athlete shall be given two (2) pieces of competitor number bibs that must be worn at all times during the hours of competition. One competitor number must be affixed on the front of the shirt or the trouser leg. The second competitor number must be affixed to the back of the wheelchair.

If an athlete forgets, loses or chooses not to wear their competitor number, they will not be permitted to enter the warm-up area, the Call Room or the field of play. A side that is not present for the start of the match forfeits the match (ref. 10.4.8). Exceptions may be considered by the Head Referee and/or the Technical Delegate.

Competition Format

According to rules of CBC, Boccia competitions are to be organized on a two-part basis: a preliminary stage of pool rounds, followed by Finals Stage of Single Elimination Round where Sides progress or are eliminated (knock-out). Pool Rounds are based on pools of 4-7 sides which all play each other once ("Round Robin" style format), with an agreed number of sides progressing to the Elimination Round.

The only exception to the above two-stage competition is where there are less than 8 entries for a division. In this situation, all sides will be in 1 pool, and only the pool round will be played with the positions of the sides after the completion of the pool being the final positions for the competition.

The numbers of entries for each division of play for the 3rd ASP Championships, as on 30 July, are as follows:

Hence, with the exception of BC4 Pairs which only have 4 entries, competitions would be organized on the above mentioned two-part basis, with pools of 4-6 sides. (BC4 Pairs would only play “pool rounds”.)

Choice of Pool Number and Pool Size

Copied below are the print-outs from a trial run of the competition program for the combinations of pools according to the above entries numbers, with the choice of pool number and total KO (knock-out) entry listed.

The elimination ratio of 40% to 70% is observed. The exception is the BC1/BC2 Teams which have 12 entries: an elimination ratio of 33.33% would be adopted (it would be less stressful for countries as in case only 4 knock-out advancers allowed). However, in case the number of entries for Teams is less than 12, for example, only 11 Teams after classification, there would only be $\frac{1}{4}$ -Finals.

In view of the time constraints, the maximum number of pools (based on the criterion of no less than 4 sides in each pool) would be chosen (highlighted in the corresponding print-outs).





The provisional competition schedule has thus been drafted according to the above combination of pools and matches to be played (see attached file [“Provisional_Schedule_090730.xls”](#)). (Appendix D)

Pool Constitution

The constitution of pools is based on the Boccia Official World Ranking List 2008 published on the CPISRA website:

http://www.cpisra.org/files/sports/boccia/Boccia_CPISRA_World_Ranking_List_2008.pdf.

Sides will be seeded according to World Ranking. Every Side with a current World Ranking shall be seeded and put in pools accordingly. Sides not on the world rankings will be placed in pools randomly through the Official Competition Draw at the Team Managers Technical Meetings.

For individual competitions, the Pool configuration must ensure that **no more than two athletes from the same country are in the same pool**. In case that a third athlete from the same country is drawn in the same Pool, this athlete shall be placed in the next available pool. The next seeded or draw will then be placed in the previous pool. For example, if that third athlete is the seed 15th, he or she would swap with the seed 16th. However, in case if that that third athlete is the last seed, he or she would swap with the one in previous pool as possible.

Determining the Final Position of sides within a Pool

The following criteria should be used to determine the position of sides in a pool once all the matches have been completed. If any sides are in an equal position after one criterion has been applied then the next criteria should be used until the sides have been separated into positions.

1st – Matches won (the number of matches won by each side, in descending order).

2nd – Point difference (the total number of points scored, minus the total number of points conceded, in descending order).

3rd – Point for (the total number of points scored in descending order).

4th – Tie-break end (the winner of an additional tie-break end).

The Team Managers will be informed of match start time for the tie-break end.

Progression From Pool Rounds to Elimination Rounds

Apart from the 1 or 2 direct advancers, there would be point-qualifiers from some of the pools progressing into elimination rounds, as elaborated above.

The following criteria are applied to determine the point-qualifiers. If any sides are in an equal position after one criterion has been applied then the next criteria should be used until the sides have been separated into positions.

1st – Average point difference (the total number of points scored, minus the total number of points conceded, divided by the number of matches played, in descending order; points obtained in tie-breaks will not be counted).

2nd – Average point for (the total number of points scored, divided by the number of matches played, in descending order; points obtained in tie-breaks will not be counted).

3rd – Tie-break end (the winner of the extra end). The Team Managers will be informed of match start time.

The winning Sides of Elimination matches progress to the next Elimination round, and losing Sides are eliminated from the competition. Those Sides that lose at the semi-final stage shall play for the Bronze Medal.

Warm Up Area Procedures

Please refer to the official CPISRA 10th Edition International Boccia Rules Section 19. Athletes may enter the Warm-Up Area 90 (ninety) minutes before their scheduled match.

Call Room Procedures

Please refer to the official CPISRA 10th Edition International Boccia Rules Section 20. A Side must be registered between thirty (30) and fifteen (15) minutes before the scheduled start time of any match. Registration is done at the Call Room Desk. Six sets of Competition Balls will be available in the Call Room for use by Sides with incomplete personal sets or no personal sets. The players are able to examine the Boccia Balls prior to the spinning of the coin.

Boccia Ball

The Organizing Committee will have 10 sets of Competition Balls available for both training and competition. Four sets shall be kept in the Warm-Up Area and the remaining six sets shall be kept in the Call Room. The set of electronic scale balance and measuring template would be placed immediately outside the entrance to the Call Room for Sides to check the eligibility of their balls before entry.

Protest Procedures

Technical Protest procedures will be as documented in the 10th edition CPISRA International Boccia Rules. Classification Protest Procedures will be as documented in the CPISRA Sports Manual 9th Edition. Protest Forms will be available from and should be returned to the Secretariat Office. The decision of all Protests shall be available at the Secretariat Office.

Anti-Doping Control

Number of Samples:	Four (4)
Testing Agency:	China Anti-Doping Agency Laboratory
Sample Collecting Agency:	Hong Kong Anti-Doping Committee, Member of WADA

Method of Selection:

1. 2 samples will be collected amongst the gold medalists of four (4) individual events on 19 August.
2. The remaining 2 samples will be collected amongst the gold medalists of Team and Pair events.
3. The individual event medalists who will undertake doping test will be drawn at 1300 at the venue on the day by the Chairman of the Organization Committee. The same will be applied to the Team and Pair event.
4. Since the semi-finals of BC 4 individual event will be held after 1300, a second draw will be held immediately after the semi- finals if BC 4 event was selected in the initial draw at 1300.

Results managements

Results after analysis of samples will be sent by China anti-Doping Agency Laboratory at CPISRA Anti Doping Committee and Results Management will be under the responsibility of CPISRA according to CPISRA Anti Doping Code.
